Birmingham Ornithology Collections

Part 1 - The R W Chase Collection of British Birds

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Introduction

Robert William Chase (1852-1927) owned a brush making business based in Upper Dean Street, Birmingham and lived variously at Edgbaston, Poole Hall Wishaw, St. Brelade's in King's Norton and Bewdley. He was a philanthropist interested in children's education and served as vice-chairman of the Blue Coat School board of governors and chairman of the Fentham Trust which supported some children attending the school. He was an extremely active member of the Birmingham Natural History and Philosophical Society, both as a regular exhibitor and as an official (for example he was President for the years 1885-1886, 1899, 1905-1907 and Treasurer for 1892-1894). Typical of the enquiring Victorian naturalist, he amassed a large collection of British birds, numbering over 1300 specimens, representing 273 species, and several thousand eggs and nests. When the collection grew too big for his then current house parts of it were stored at his factory premises. Some of his collection was put on loan with Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery in 1910 and these specimens were on show during the British Association meeting in Birmingham in 1913; Chase contributed the section on ornithology for the accompanying British Association Handbook. In June 1924 the whole collection was purchased by the Feeney Charitable Trust for just over £3,000 and presented to Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery.

Chase collected many specimens himself, especially in Norfolk, the Farne Isles and Pembrokeshire, often risking his own life and limb as well as brushes with the law to acquire specimens. He also received many gifts from friends and associates as well as purchasing specimens from dealers (for example Pratt & Sons, Brighton) and other contacts (such as G. Cooke, Shrewsbury and J. Evans of Bourne, Lincolnshire). He also made purchases at sales particularly from the mid 1880s to early 1890s leading to specimens from earlier collections entering his own (F. Raine, F. Bond, Edwin Bayliss, Cobourn and Vingoe for example).

He employed the services of some of the best taxidermists available to mount or re-mount his specimens and over twenty are represented in his collection. These include well known Birmingham taxidermists such as Betteridge, Bloxham, Franklin and Spicer as well as those from further afield including Cullingford of Durham, Saville of Brighton and Jones in Bridlington. As with many late Victorian and Edwardian collectors Chase also had a go at mounting some specimens himself (usually larger species such as Eagle Owl, White-tailed Eagle and King Eider with the Little Auk, Ruff and Redshank being his smallest examples). Unfortunately many of his cases are neither signed nor have a comment in Chase's catalogue so the taxidermist is unknown.

Although a few study skins are present, the majority of his collection was mounted in cases. Small, plain cases were used mainly for small birds while larger plain cases often included branches. Among the best for detail are the semi-habitat cases although these also often only have a plain background. A large selection of fledglings were originally mounted under glass domes, many by Betteridge of Birmingham.

Chase catalogued his collection in the order of the BOU List of British Birds for 1883, a practice which does not seem to have been followed by any of his contemporaries. This publication listed 452 species of which 76 were sufficiently rare to have been "*included in square brackets, leaving 376 species as the ascertained number of British birds*". Chase selectively numbered the entries not in square brackets from 1 to 349, omitting some twenty seven species which he presumably felt were never likely to be obtained. He then entered these by hand into a hard bound book ready to add details of specimens as he acquired them rather like a train spotter's list! Of this wish list of 349 species there were over seventy which Chase never managed to acquire. Some of these were obvious scarce, occasional visitors to Britain while others were common birds such as shags and cormorants. In other instances he had several varieties of common birds but no normal forms, for

example the Song Thrush where his catalogue lists six varieties and is then annotated “normal forms wanted”. Rare Vagrants in his collection included the Hooded Merganser, Gull-billed Tern, Great Bustard, Little Bustard, Hen Harrier, Long-tailed duck and King Eider. His collection contained the only British example of Brandt’s (East) Siberian Meadow Bunting (*Emberiza cioïdes*) which he numbered 350 and which was admitted to the British List in 1948 on the basis of Chase’s specimen but removed again in the 1960s. As with many other contemporary collectors his aim seems to have been to acquire examples of males, females, juveniles, nestlings and varieties wherever possible.

Provenances

Out of a collection of over thirteen hundred specimens Chase recorded provenances for all but 89 of them, a mere 6.7%. The table below shows the distribution of these.

The broad geographical spread of provenances, covering most of the British Isles, shows the wide range of contacts which Chase and other early collectors formed as well as the national scale of the trade in taxidermy specimens. The highest number of specimens comes from Norfolk, a hive of both early taxidermy and a good place for encountering waders and rare vagrants, as it remains today. The second highest total is from Northumberland and this, together with higher than average numbers from south Wales, equally reflect particularly active natural bird locations, obviously as big a draw to early collectors and traders in birds as they are to modern twitchers. On the other hand, birds from Sussex and Kent are fewer than one might expect and Chase does not seem to have fallen prey to the Hastings Rarities affair. The high concentrations from Warwickshire, Worcestershire and, to a lesser extent, Staffordshire reflect Chase’s local interest as does that from Shropshire although the latter may have been inflated by his relationship with Cooke of Shrewsbury. Also probably influenced by personal contact is another concentration from Durham

where the taxidermist Cullingford was based, known to have been employed extensively by Chase, especially for what might be termed remedial work on his specimens.

Date of Specimens

Chase's catalogue records the date when some 83% of the specimens were collected in the field (not necessarily the same as the date when Chase acquired them). If one excludes the kestrel, recorded as being "very old", the oldest piece in his collection dates from 1837/38. Over half (55%) of the collection was collected during the fourteen year period 1878 to 1891. A breakdown of dates is given in the table below.

Associations

Notes

1 John Betteridge (1872-1951) was a well known Birmingham taxidermist. First entry in trade directory 1876. Joined by his son William in 1900. William died in 1960. The contents of his shop were sold in 1959 and Birmingham Museum acquired some specimens at that time. William Betteridge's apprentice, Warwick Egginton, opened a shop but just for one year.

2 Bloxham was a late nineteenth century taxidermist and barber based at Alcester Street , Birmingham.

- 3 Frederick Bond was a well known nineteenth century naturalist who collected birds and *Lepidoptera*. He made donations to the British Museum (Natural History) and his collection was dispersed by auction after his death. (*Zoologist* 1899, 401-422).
- 4 E.T. Clarke was a taxidermist based at Cheltenham.
- 5 John Cullingford (1878-1905) was taxidermist at Durham University Museum. Chase often used Cullingford to re-mount specimens.
- 6 Walter Earle set up a preparatory school at Yarlet Hall in 1873. In 1887 he moved to Bilton Grange at Dunchurch near Rugby.
- 7 J H Gurney was a well known ornithologist and collector at Keswick Hall, Norwich. He had a complete collection of British stuffy skins and was author of a 500 page monograph on the gannet. His collection was sold on 8th July 1890.
- 8 William Hope was a taxidermist based at 44 Hope Street, Edinburgh who on at least some of his labels proclaimed himself “stuffer to the Museum of Science and Art”.
- 9 Possibly the Brighton based taxidermist W.A. Knight?
- 10 Walter Lowne was a taxidermist at Great Yarmouth operating from the 1870s until 1913.
- 11 Possibly H. Murray & Son, taxidermists at Carnforth, Lancs?
- 12 Pashley was a taxidermist at Cley-next-the-Sea, Norfolk.
- 13 The business, founded by Henry Pratt, operated from 1851 to 1952. It was the last commercial taxidermy business to operate in Brighton.
- 14 Presumably W.P. Pycraft, curator at the British Museum (Natural History).
- 15 His collection was sold 30.03.1885.
- 16 Presumably the taxidermy firm of Thomas Roberts & Son, Norwich.
- 17 Howard Saunders (1835-1907) *Zoologist* 1907, 436-438
- 18 Smith wrote *The Birds of Somersetshire* and *The Birds of Guernsey*. His collection was sold by Stevens on 24th June 1890.
- 19 Jannion Steele-Elliot (1871-?) of Dowles Manor, Bewdley was born in Bedfordshire and began a major work on the fauna of Bedfordshire but which he never finished. He donated birds to the general collections at Birmingham
- 20 Henry Stevenson (1833-88) of Scoulton, Norfolk collection sold in two sales in Norwich on 12th September 1887 and 21st March 1899. He was secretary to the Norfolk and Norwich Museum and regularly recorded Norfolk birds in the *Zoologist*.
- 21 Rector of Bury St. Edmunds from 1887. He contributed the section on birds to the VCH Suffolk.
- 22 His collection was sold at Stevens 13.05.1889.
- 23 Taxidermist active from 1848-1912.
- 24 G.S.P. Saville was a taxidermist at Brighton. He worked in Birmingham for two years (1880-81) with Aaron Franklin at 31 Suffolk Street. Taxidermist to the Queen and Masons’ College. His work for Chase is of high quality.
- 25 Taxidermist at Navigation Street, Birmingham. His shop was open until the 1960s.

The Checklist

The checklist which follows includes all the information given in Chase’s original handwritten catalogue. It follows the current British List for ease of reference rather than Chase’s original order, with species not represented on the list inserted under the appropriate family. The columns are arranged in the following order:

1. Birmingham accession number
2. Chase’s original number
3. details of sex, maturity and varieties. The following abbreviations have been used: m = male, f = female, dow = downie, imm = immature, juv = juvenile, nes = nestling (downies and nestlings are

often mounted in groups and the number of specimens in a group is given as a figure after the abbreviation), alb =albino, alc = albinistic, cin = cinnamon, ha = hairy, mel = melanic, pi = pied.

4. date of collection (given in the format dd.mm.yyyy but where only the year is known this is given as 00.00.yyyy and where no exact day is known it is given as 00.mm.yyyy)

5. county of origin

6. detailed provenance where known

7. notes which follow the main listing. These consist of Chase's annotations on individual specimens but in order to save space and repetition these have been edited into footnotes

An x in any column denotes that the information is not available from Chase's catalogue.
